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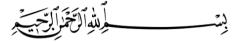

ABSTRACT

This research deals with students' perception of plagiarism at FKIP UMSU. The objective of this research is toknow the students' perception about plagiarism. CHAPTER II

REVIEW OF RELATED LITERATURE

A. Theoretical Framework

The theoretical framework aimed at giving concepts applied in this research. These concepts leaded to be better analysis of the given theories because they help the writer limit the scope of the problem. In this part, the researcher explained about all of the theories used to strengthen the research. So that the reader understands and encourage them to read.

1. Description of Perception

Think of all the ways in which you experience the world around you. For example, you recognize your favorite food by its aroma and the way it looks. You recognize an orange by its round shape, citrus flavor, and its color. You recognize a song by listening to its melody and the singer's voice. It is through these sensory experiences that we interact with and interpret things in our world. Recognizing and interpreting sensory information, such as sound and smells, are all a part of perception.

Perception is the process of recognizing and interpreting sensory stimuli. Learn the definition of perception, how it is related to the five senses, how it differs from reality, and more.(Angell, 2006).

Perception is the process by which people sense, select, organize, and interpret information, to form a subjectively meaningful picture of the world so as to identify, retrieve, and respond to the information (Broadbent, 2008).

Perception can be defined as our recognition and interpretation of sensory information. Perception also includes how we respond to the information. We can think of perception as a process where we take in sensory information from our environment and use that information in order to interact with our environment. Perception allows us to take the sensory information in and make it into something meaningful.(Brown, 2012)

For example, let's look at our perception of words. Each letter of the alphabet is in itself a singular letter. When we perceive words, we think of them as one singular unit that is made up of smaller parts called letters. It is through this organization of letters into words that we are able to make something meaningful. That is, we perceive an entire word, and this word has a specific meaning that can be found in the dictionary.

Perception is also necessary for us to survive in our environment. For example, before parents feed their babies microwaves food, they taste it in order to make sure that the temperature isn't too hot. This involves using sensory information (touch and taste) to make sure that the food is not dangerous for the infant. Before we cross a busy street, we rely on our hearing and sight to make sure a car is not coming. Without the sensory information, we would not be able to judge which food was too hot or when an appropriate time to cross the street would be, which could put us and our children in danger.

To study the world means to study perceptions and ideas we creat-ed, and the world is mainly the world of perceptions, images or ide-as. Thus, when we want to study something, first we should know where, when and how to meet and learn it. But that is not enough. John Locke and the entire epistemological tradition following him was convinced that if we can find the answer to the question about sources and procedures of cognition, we will be able to relevantly answer the questions about its legitimacy, validity, nature and limits. Actually, the certainty of any statement is based on the trustworthiness of the authority that postulates it. Thus, if we want to believe our knowledge, we must know, where it is coming from, how it was being formed and how it was subsequently being proliferated. As said in Descartes style: we must verify the knowl-edge principles themselves.(Andrej Démuth, 2012).

Perceptions and sensing represent a unique source of how to ex-perience something at all. Since cognition was at first the domain of philosophy, it is obvious philosophers were also the first group of people to study the issues of perception. Antique thinkers such as Democritus and others developed mainly speculative theories (about atomic structures — eidolon — being received by our senses) on the basis of which they tried to explain how we perceive some-thing. Aristotle chose a similar way of thinking, although a less ma-terialistic one (the shapes entering our mind) and the stoics had their own conception as well. The theories of perception became publication of ground–breaking work by Robert Woodworth (Ex-perimental Psychology 1938) may be regarded as the height of this emancipation effort. In the second half of the twentieth century, due to the influence of behaviorism and the arrival of neuropsychological approaches, attention was turning to scientific testing of sensory discrimination abilities and to studying the neuroanatomical correlation of per- ception (A.R. Lurija). As the

knowledge of neuroanatomical, physicological and functional dependencies as well as the new display and examination processes and mainly of the electrophysiological records which were developing, the neuroanatomical "substrata" of receptivity became one of the best analyzed fields of perception and as a result of this the structure and function of individual re-ceptors as well as their functional connections with neural centers were becoming relatively well mapped. However, a one–sided em-phasis on the study and description of "external" mechanisms of perception resulted in a deficiency of learning about "the contents" of perception.

In the 1930s, many thinkers (philosophers, psychologists) turned their attention from studying basic elements of perception to studying entire patterns (mental ones mainly). The holists be-lieved that studying such a complex matter as perception cannot be done by just studying the individual qualities which can be usu-ally described only from the outside (by a third party). Therefore the mentalists, the representationalists and the gestaltists looked for the essence of perception "from within" by searching for the patterns of perception organization and of the sensory field and its structure. Phenomenal experience and mentalistic concepts which are able to describe it, became the main object of their study. Deriving from the works of a brentanist Christian von Ehrenfels and from the phenomenology of Edmund Husserl, they did not under-stand perception as just a physiological and mechanical process of acquiring data, but they considered its subjective understanding and interpretation as the key point.

2. Social Perception

Social perceptionis how an individual "sees" others and how others perceivean individual. This is accomplished through various means such asclassifying an individual based on a single characteristic (halo effect), evaluating a person's characteristics by comparison to others (contrasteffect), perceiving others in ways that really reflect a perceiver's own attitudes and beliefs (projection).

2.1 Halo Effect

The halo effect occurs when an individual draws a general impression aboutanother person based on a single characteristic, such as intelligence, sociability, or appearance. The perceiver may evaluate the other individual high on many traits because of his or her belief that the individual is highin one trait. For example, if an employee performs a difficult accountingtask well due to the manager's belief of the employee's high intelligence, then the manager may also erroneously perceive the employee as having competencies in other areas such as management or technology.

The halo effect is applicable to individuals' perceptions of others and of organizations. For example, a hospital that is well known for its openheart and cardiac programs may be perceived in the community as excellent other departments such as obstetrics or orthopedics whether proven to be true or not.

2.2 Contrast Effect

Research has provided evidence that perceptions are also subject to whatis termed perceptual contrast effects. Contrast effects relate to an

individual's evaluation of another person's characteristics based on (or affectedby) comparisons with other people who rank higher or lower on the samecharacteristics. For example, Wedell, Parducci, and Geiselman (2006) found that, if compared to a highly attractive person, a target person of average attractiveness is judged less attractive than he or she would havebeen if rated on his or her own. When asked to contrast a target personwith persons who were more physically attractive, ratings of attractivenessof the target were more negative; and when the target person was compared with those less attractive, it resulted in more positive evaluations (Thornton & Moore, 2007). In other words, the contrast effect relatesto how an individual is perceived in relation to others around himor her. The contrast effect not only applies to the perception of attractiveness, but it has also been shown to influence self-esteem, public selfconsciousness, and social anxiety (Thornton and Moore, 2007). It stands to reason that a worker's performance would be judged in contrast to the workers around him or her. However, managers need to be aware of this contrast effect bias when interviewing job candidates or evaluating aworker's performance.

2.3 Projection

Whereas, contrast effect is the perception of an individual based on the the comparison to others, projection is the attribution of one's own attitudes and beliefs onto others. All of us are guilty of unconsciously projecting our own beliefs onto others. Projection was a defensive mechanism, where we attribute our own attitudes onto someoneelse as a defense against our feelings of anxiety or guilt.

Projection canmean ascribing to others the negatives that we find inside ourselves, thereby protecting our self-esteem. Who has never blamed others for making them late to work, going off a diet, or being in a bad mood (whenit was themselves at fault)? Projection is an interesting human tendency. Projection allows an individual to perceive others in ways that really reflect oneself because, in general, people are in favor of those who are mostlike themselves.

3. Description of Plagiarism

A common element across definitions is that plagiarism is the act of using another author's work without citation, thus portraying it as one's own work. Other common elements of definitions include descriptions of the length of the copied text, whether taking solely ideas from other authors is plagiarism, and the extent that the copied words were taken verbatim. For the present study a definition of plagiarism was developed that addressed these elements:

Plagiarism is representing another author's ideas or words as your own in course documents or electronic postings. This would include submitting an entire document by another author as well as using a portion of text or ideas from another author's work and not citing the source. This would include information obtained from the internet, from other students, and from published and unpublished documents. This definition was provided to the students on the survey they completed (Reva Fish, 2013).

3.1 Plagiarism along a Continum.

Incidents of plagiarism are viewed along a continuum, with some incidents regarded as more serious than others (Blum, 2009). Studies of faculty and student

understandings of plagiarism have found that faculty view most types of plagiarism as more serious than students view them (Kwong et al., 2010). Jones (2011) found that while all students recognized submitting an entire document written by another author as plagiarism, students saw copying a limited amount of text as less serious. Seventy-five percent of students saw purchasing a paper online as plagiarism, 67% thought copying text verbatim without quotation marks was plagiarism, 50% saw paraphrasing text without citation as plagiarism, and 17% stated that students should not self-plagiarize by submitting the same work for assignments in different classes.

Plagiarism is a complex issue which has been studied using a variety of frameworks. Someresearch has focused on student characteristics that predict a greater likelihood of committingplagiarism, including levels of moral reasoning and self-esteem as well as achievement andmotivation orientations (Angell, 2006). This perspective attributes the decision to plagiarize to characteristics of the students, discounting outside factors that might contribute to the choice to plagiarize.

Other research has regarded incidents of plagiarism as being the result of teaching style (Barnas, 2008) or classroom culture (Brown, 2012) indicating the cause of plagiarism originates outside the student. From these perspectives, instructors are seen ascontributing to students' beliefs that they can submit another author's work as their own by notproviding an adequate level of rigor in their classrooms or by not checking student work forplagiarism.

Unintentional plagiarism has also been used as a framework for research (Blum, 2009). This viewpoint often raises the question ofwhether students should be penalized when they are unaware they have plagiarized. While proof intent to plagiarize is typically not believed to be necessary to support an accusation, whetherstudents who are still learning to write academic papers should be expected to fully understandhow to avoid plagiarism has been addressed in these studies.

Ethics, and in particular integrity, is another focus of the research on plagiarism(Conway & Groshek, 2009). Thatbody of work examines plagiarism at the student, instructor, and institution levels, and emphasizes the need for institutions to convey the importance of honesty to students and forfaculty to model ethical behavior for them. More recently the focus of plagiarism research has been on technology-facilitated electronic access to text as a primary cause of the increase in the number of incidents ofplagiarism. This method ofplagiarism has become increasingly widespread through the effortless process of copying andpasting electronic text. Some studies have found that students may believe information on theinternet does not belong to a particular author and, therefore, can legitimately be used by them incourse assignments. The present study looked at plagiarism from the perspective of social/peer norms. According to social norms theory, individuals learn whichbehaviors are appropriate by observing the generally accepted behavior of others. For example, young adults have been found to overestimate the frequency of negative behaviors such assubstance abuse by their peers, resulting in an inaccurate understanding of what is considered socially

acceptable and an increase in those negative behaviors on their part. If students have themisperception that acts of plagiarism are common among their classmates, and that consequences, if any, are minor, they are more likely to commit plagiarism themselves.

A common element across definitions is that plagiarism is the act of using another author's workwithout citation, thus portraying it as one's own work. Other common elements of definitions include descriptions of the length of the copied text, whether taking solely ideas from other authors is plagiarism, and the extent that the copied words were taken verbatim. For the present study a definition of plagiarism was developed that addressed these elements:

Plagiarism is representing another author's ideas or words as your own in course documents orelectronic postings. This would include submitting an entire document by another author as wellas using a portion of text or ideas from another author's work and not citing the source. This would include information obtained from the internet, from other students, and from publishedand unpublished documents. This definition was provided to the students on the survey they completed. Incidents of plagiarism are viewed along a continum, with some incidents regarded as more serious than others. Studies of faculty and student understandings of plagiarism have found that faculty viewmost types of plagiarism as more serious than students view them. While all students recognized submitting an entire document written by anotherauthor as plagiarism, students saw copying a limited amount of text as less serious. Seventy-fivepercent of students saw purchasing a paper online as plagiarism, 67% thought copying

textverbatim without quotation marks was plagiarism, 50% saw paraphrasing text without citation asplagiarism, and 17% stated that students should not self-plagiarize by submitting the same workfor assignments in different classes.

The pattern of students being less likely to commit the types of plagiarism they saw as more serious was not evident in their reports of the plagiarism they believe was committed by other students. Consistent with the findings from other research (Engler et al., 2008), the participants reported that other students were markedly more likely than them to commit each type of plagiarism. In fact, a small proportion of participants reported they believe some students always commit each of the four types of plagiarism. The implications of these findings must be considered in relation to social norms theory (Berkowitz, 2008) and the research by McCabe et al. (2007) and Rettinger and Kramer (2009) which found that when students believe others have cheated, they are more likely to choose to cheat. Students who overestimate the frequency of plagiarism by classmates may view plagiarizing as a norm and choose to plagiarize to complete an assignment. In particular, they may be more likely to think it is okay to use another author's ideas or text phrases - types of plagiarism, which they view as less serious. Therefore, it is critical that students have accurate information about the frequency and types of plagiarism committed by students in their classes and at their school. Institutions and course instructors must find ways to give students accurate information about the types of plagiarism that occur and number of incidents that are discovered. A campus-wide reporting system should be used to gather and distribute the information, and faculty can tell students the number and

type of actual incidents they encounter semester to semester. Supplied with this information, students will be less likely to overestimate the number of incidents of plagiarism at their school and may, therefore, be less likely to plagiarize themselves. Informing students that instructors look for plagiarism in assignments and that there are consequences if it is discovered can help to deter students from plagiarizing and create an environment where it is clear that ethical behavior is valued. Reducing plagiarism provides benefits beyond an ethical education environment; it can also improve student learning. When students do their own work, instead of copying it from another author, they learn research and writing skills, and they learn the topic content of the papers they write. The long-term benefits of an academic environment where integrity and learning are cultivated cannot be overestimated. One limitation of this study is the possibility that the participants who chose to respond to the survey may have been those who actually were less likely to plagiarize than their classmates and therefore their claim that others are more likely to plagiarize was accurate. More than half of the respondents had a grade point average over 3.5, and studies have found that students with lower grade point averages are more likely to plagiarize (Belter & DuPre, 2009).

Plagiarism is not a new phenomenon. Copying from other writers is probably as old aswriting itself, but until the advent of mass-produced writing, it remained hidden from the public gaze.

Like many things, plagiarism is seen differently when viewed through different lenses. Now widely considered a vice, in days past it was sometimes considered a virtue, imitation being considered the highest form of flattery. This same tension still holds truetoday in some non-Western cultures, and it must be taken into account when dealing appropriately with plagiarism by students from different cultural backgrounds, grounded in different notions of respect for authority and different traditions of academic writing.

Plagiarism means taking the words and thoughts of others (their ideas, concepts, images, sentences, and so forth) and using them as if they were your own, without crediting theauthor or citing the source. Most plagiarism is willful, a sort of theft. It is possible to plagiarizeunintentionally, though, by being careless or hurried, omitting quotation marks or slipping intothe words or ideas of others through inattention or simply for convenience. Whether you meantit or not, you can be found guilty of plagiarism whenever other people's language gets usedwithout proper citation in your text. At this and most other universities, plagiarism is regarded asintellectual theft; faculty will rarely bother to determine whether you stole words on purpose orwalked out of the shop having forgotten to pay. There are basically three kinds of plagiarism:

- 3.1.1 Using another person's exact words without including quotation marks and citation. If you use someone else's exact words, then you must cite the original source (either in a footnote or in a citation in the text), and you must enclose the words in quotation marks or else set them off from the rest of the text by indenting them from the other text.
- 3.1.2 Using another person's words, but changing some of them, or rearranging them. This is plagiarism even if the source is cited.

3.1.3 Summarizing or paraphrasing another person's words without citation. If you use what someone else has written, but you describe it or summarize it in your own words, then you don't need to enclose it in quotation marks, but you still must provide a citation to the original source, either in a footnote or directly in the text. Note that it's not enough to simply include a reference to the original source in your bibliography; "citation" of the original source means citing it where it appears in the text (Conway, 2009).

3.2 The Example of Plagiarism

There are some examples of plagiarism in the following: (a) Purchasing or copying a paper from the Internet, (b) Borrowing your roommate's lab report and using his or her description of the experiment describe your findings, (c) Turning in a paper as your own that you didn't write, d) Copying (cutting and pasting) material without acknowledging the source, (e) Using material when an author has been identified but not using quotation marks toreflect his or her original words, and (f) Inadequate paraphrasing

Each of these points will be discussed below, but first let's consider why the academic community is so opposed to plagiarism.

3.3 Strategies to Avoid Plagiarism

There are some strategies to avoid plagiarism in the following: (a) Isolate the reasons why plagiarism occurs, (b) Identify the different types of plagiarism, and (c) Integrate plagiarism prevention.

3.4 The Kinds of Plagiarism

There are two kinds of plagiarism, they are unintentional plagiarism and intentional plagiarism (Barnas, 2008).

3.4.1 Unintentional Plagiarism

- a) Paraphrasing poorly:changing afew words without changing the sentence structure of the original, or changing the sentence structure but not the words.
- b) Quoting poorly: putting quotation marks around part of a quotation but not around all of it,or putting quotation marks around a passage that is partly paraphrased and partly quoted.
- c) Citing poorly: omitting an occasional citation or citing inaccurately.

3.4.2 Intentional Plagiarism

- a) Passing off as one's own pre-written papers from the Internet or other sources.
- b) Copying an essay or article from the Internet, on-line source, or electronic database without quoting or giving credit.
- c) Cutting and pasting from more than one source to create a paper without quoting or giving credit.
- d) Borrowingwords or ideas from other students or sources without giving credit.

3.5 Types of Plagiarism

The first type of plagiarism is:

- 1) Plagiarism of Words
 - a) The use of another's exact words without citing the author

b) Incorrect

Plagiarism is the reproduction of someone else's words, ideas or findings and presenting them as one's own without proper acknowledgement.

c) Correct

Plagiarism is the reproduction of someone else's words, ideas or findings and presenting them as one's ownproper acknowledgement.

2) Plagiarism of Structure

- a) Paraphrasing another's words by changing sentence construction or word choice with citation
- b) Paraphrasing while maintaining original sentence construction with acknowledging the source.

3) Copyread

If a person or an organization holds the copyright on a piece of writing etc., they are the only people who have the legal right to publish, broadcast, etc., and other people must ask their permission to use it or any part of it.

B. Conceptual Framework

Even though plagiarism has been a universal problem in academic writing for decades in university of Muhammadiyah Sumatera Utara, the concept of plagiarism and its seriousness did not attract the attention scholars until recently when a prestigious university in UMSU revoked a doctoral degree from a graduate due to plagiarism detection in study. This incident was the only case that had ever happened at this university. A number of institutions have announced a policy to address plagiarism as part of their educational programs. Some institutions have installed plagiarism checking software to detect transgressions in students' papers. Discouragingly, most anti-plagiarism policies generally point toward students' responsibility without consideration of the importance of institutional and instructional support. In all cases, plagiarism is regarded as a severe moral issue, in fact there are also other facets of plagiarism that deserve critical consideration and action. Looking at plagiarism solely from a moral perspective can potentially mislead policy makers and practitioners and consequently can undermine learning opportunities as well as students' positive learning experience.

It is means that the teacher has an important role in improving student's skill, especially in plagiarism. Based on the researcher's experience at FKIP English Education University Muhammadiyah Sumatera Utara many student can not make idea from themself think, students do not fully about plagiarism, it cause the traditional plagiarism in copy paste, and tradition of do not include researcher, so level of students understanding about plagiarism is not good.

The researcher consideration in carrying out this research is based on the view that plagiarism is an essential component of language. Based on the explanation above, the researcher will be focused on the plagiarism of the perception on the students' at FKIP English EducationUniversity Muhammadiyah Sumatera Utara.

CHAPTER III

METHOD OF RESEARCH

A. Research Design

In this study, descriptive quantitative was applied to identify, to describe, to classify and to analyze the students' perception of plagiarism. The quantitative technique was used to collect the data to find out the students' perception of plagiarism.

B. Source of Data

The term data refers to the rough material the researchers collect from the world they studying; they are the particulars that form the basis of analysis. Data in this study are needed to answer research questionaire. Data in this study were the seventh semester students of University Muhammadiyah Sumatera Utara, namely A class that consists of 13 students, B class are 13 students and C class are 14 students. So the total number of the subject was 40 students. Data that researcher got in this research were in the form of the result of questionaire. By getting the data through questionaire, hopefully it will be valid data because most of the students are lazy to think and they just want to get the result instant and quickly and then they are lazy to do assingment. That is the reason why the researcher choose the seventh semester of University Muhammadiyah Sumatera Utara as the subject of this research.

C. Instrument of the Research

The research instrument is part of data collecting technique. In this study the researcher collected the data by using interview that consist of six questions.

The steps of observation that follow:

- 1. The researcher interviewed the students by using good and clear language.
- 2. The researcher given the questions about the plagiarism according to them.
- 3. The researcher wrote the result of interview.
- 4. The researcher discussed and make the conclusion.

D. Technique of Data Analysis

The main component of the process of analysis in this study are (1) data reduction, (2) the presentation of data, (3) drawing conclusions or verification (Miles & Huberman in Moleong, 2012:4). Data analysis model used is an interactive analysis model (*interactive models of analysis*). The workings of the interactive model in the form of interaction between the components of the data collection process as the process in the form of a cycle.

This study begins with data collection. Researchers move between components analysis interactively while still collecting data. The next step after the data is collected, the researcher only move between the three components of the analysis. Reduction and presentation of data arranged in time researchers have obtained the data unit of a number of units of data are required. When data collection is sufficient and complete, researchers began to make conclusions and verification based on the things contained in the reduction and data presentation. If in making the conclusion of researchers feel there is a shortage, researchers collecting data again to further provide support and increase understanding and deepening. Interactive cycle is executed several times until it is enough and deep.

The following steps was implemented for analyzing the data:

- 1. Arranging the important point about the students' answer about perception of plagiarism.
- 2. Comparing the students' answer from one students' to another students' answer.
- 3. Processing the data become simple description that focus on the perception of plagiarism.
- 4. Concluding the result of observation.

CHAPTER IV

DATA AND DATA ANALYSIS

A. Data

As stated at the chapter 3 in collecting the data, the researcher used the instrument, it was the interview which consisted of six questions. The interview is conducted to know their perceptions about plagiarism. As stated before, the main component of analysis in this study are (1) data reduction, (2) the presentation of data, (3) drawing conclusions or verification. However, the data reduction of this research can be seen on appendix, and the presentation of data, drawing conclusions can be seen below:

1. Presentation of Data

The presentation of data in this research is the students' answer about the plagiarism, they are as follow:

2. Verifications

This research deals with the students' perception about plagiarism. This research surveyed 40 students at University of Muhammadiyah Sumatera Utara. There was 6 questions used of this research to know the students' perception about plagiarism. Based on the data above, it can be analyzed that the students' perception about plagiarism from question 1 to question 6.

2.1 What do you think about plagiarism?

Based on students' answer, it can be seen that the students' asnwer of the first questions was different. It means that there was a different mindset from the students about plagiarism. But, from the table above, most of the students' answer can be accepted as a logically.

According to the expert, plagiarism is representing another author's ideas or words as your own in course documents or electronic postings. This would include submitting an entire document by another author as well as using a portion of text or ideas from another author's work and not citing the source. This would include information obtained from the internet, from other students, and from published and unpublished documents.

From the table above, the writer concluded that the students' answer who get near to the expert about plagiarism as many as 33 students, and the students'

asnwer who are not related to the expert about plagiarism as many as 7 students. The students' answer who are not related to the expert was students' number: 008, 011, 015, 018, 033 and 038, their answer is as follows:

008 : Plagiarism is the act of plagianting on plot that has been plagiarized

011 : I think plagiarism is the result of works people

015 : I think plagiarism is a multifaceted and ethically complex problem

018 : Plagiarism is an act of fraud

033 : I think plagiarism is a multifaceted and ethically complex problem

038 : Plagiarism is an act of fraud. It involves both stealing someone else's work and lying about afterward

However, from the data above, the students' answer cannot be said false, because each of students have different idea about plagiarism. Their answers only can not related to the expert definition. It is important to note that the students' do not see "paragraphing someone else's words" as a form of plagiarism, indicating that it is an apparently accepted practice to paraphrase as long as the work is cited.

Based on the table above, the writer concluded that most of the students' knew about what plagiarism is, it can be seen from their answer about first question. Although their answer were different but in the mind point, plagiarism is the use of another's ideas and/or words without a clear acknowledgement of the source of the information.

2.2 Why is plagiarism inappropriate?

Based on students' answer, it can be seen that the students' asnwer of the second questions was different. It means that there was a different mindset from the students why is plagiarism inappropriate. From the students' answer above, it is indicated that most of the students' answer that the plagiarism was inappropriate because plagiarism is bad action, steal of words and theft of people work, for example:

001 : Because plagiarism is bad action and can be punished

002 : Because plagiarism is steal of the idea, words, the sentence

006 : Because plagiarism is theft on intellectual

009 : Because plagiarism as acts theft and borrow opinion

These answers can accepted as logically, with reason that the people who are conducted the plagiarism is a bad action and the people who are do it can be punished. And then, from the students' answer above, there was each of the students who are not understand why is plagiarism inappropriate, for example:

008 : Because plagiarism is the result of research and others serve as if
as work alone

This answer can not be comprehend by the people, becase this answer was not related to the questions. But, it is important to note that most of the students' knew why is plagiarism inappropriate, although their answer was different, but they were knew that the plagiarism was a bad action and according their answer, plagiarism can make them lazy and make them as a bad character. It can be seen from all of their answer of question 2.

2.3 What are the example of plagiarism that you know?

Based on students' answer, it can be seen that the students' asnwer of the third questions was different. It means that there was a different mindset of example of plagiarism. In chapter II, the example of plagiarism is:

- a) Purchasing or copying a paper from the Internet
- Borrowing your roommate's lab report and using his or her description of the experiment to describe your findings
- c) Turning in a paper as your own that you didn't write
- d) Copying (cutting and pasting) material without acknowledging the source
- e) Using material when an author has been identified but not using quotation marks to effect his or her original words

From the students' answer above, it is indicated that most of the students' knew what example of plagiarism, a good example:

- 001 : Example acknowledge the work of the group as possession or the results of herself
- 015 : For example acknowledge the findings of another persons as possession herself
- 016 : Example : copying information from the source of the web
- 017 : For example plagiarize the skripsi or proposal
- 021 : Example: a student is expected to write a research paper on a topic in his history class

These answers can accepted, because these answer get near to expert example of plagiarism in chapter II. And then, from the students' answer above,

there was each of the students who are not understand the example of plagiarism, for example:

005 : For the example is the case of plagiarism merk

026 : For example is the case of plagiarism merk

This answer can not be accepted, becase this answer was not related to the expert example of plagiarism, with reasons the "merk" can be same but the "content" must be different. But, it is important to note that most of the students' knew the example of plagiarism, although their answer was different, but they were knew the example of plagiarsm. It can be seen from all of their answer of question 3.

2.4 Is it true or false if we do the plagiarism? give your reason!

Based on students' answer, it can be seen that the students' asnwer of the fourth questions was different. It means that there was a different mindset of the students is plagiarism true or false. From the students' answer above, it is indicated that all of the students' knew plagiarism is false, a good example is:

010 : I think false, because you deny yourself the opportunity to learn and practice skills that may be needed in your future careers

022 : Yes false, because make a person did not want to think

These answers can accepted as logically, with reason that the people who are conducted the plagiarism is a bad action and the people who are do it can be punished. It is important to note that all of the students' knew that the plagiarism is false, although their reason was different, but they were knew the plagiarsm is false. It can be seen from all of their answer of question 4.

2.5 Why do students plagiarise?

Based on students' answer, it can be seen that the students' asnwer of the fifth questions was different. It means that there was a different mindset why the students' do plagiarism. From the students' answer above, it is indicated that most of the students' understand why do plagiarism, a good example is:

001 : Because people lazy to think

002 : Because don't need a lot of time

006 : Because the low interest in reading and interest doing an analysis of the source of reference owned

005 : Because there is no skill in the investigations

These answers can accepted as logically, with reason that the students who are conducted the plagiarism is lazy to think, don't have a lot of time, low interest and there is not skill. This reason can be seen in daily life. And then, from the students' answer above, there was each of the students who are not understand why students do plagiarism, for example:

011 : Beause want to be seen a brainy student

012 : Because want to get a confession from the public

013 : Because want to famous in the class

016 : Because want to look smart

017 : Because want to famous

026 : Because want to get a confession from the public

030 : Because want to be seen a brainy student

034 : Because want to famous

035 : Because want to look smart

This answer can not be accepted, becase this answer was not related to the questions. The students who are conducted the plagiarism was not related to *brainy, confession, famous* and *smart,* but the plagiarism is a bad action and improperly. But, it is important to note that most of the students' knew the why the students do plagiarism, although their answer was different, but they were knew why the students do plagiarsm. It can be seen from all of their answer of question 5.

2.6 How to prevent plagiarism?

Based on the table above, it can be seen that the students' asnwer of the sixth questions was different. It means that there was a different mindset of the students how to prevent the plagiarism. From the students' answer above, it is indicated that all of the students' knew how to prevent the plagiarism, a good example is:

001 : Understand topics to be discussed

002 : *Understand what plagiarism is*

005 : Make a quote immediately, namely with a copy sentence the phrase

010 : Put quotation marks aroudn unique phrases you think could be interpreted as being copied

015 : Understand some rules basic copyright

These answers can accepted as logically, with reason that to prevent the plagiarism is must be understand the topics to be discussed and understand some rules of copyright. It is important to note that all of the students' knew how to prevent the plagiarism, although their reason was different, but they were knew how to prevent the plagiarism. It can be seen from all of their answer of question 6.

B. Data Analysis

Based on the research results, it can be analyzed that, in question 1: most of the students' knew about what plagiarism is, it can be seen from their answer about first question. Although their answer were different but in the mind point, plagiarism is the use of another's ideas and/or words without a clear acknowledgement of the source of the information.

Question 2: most of the students' knew why is plagiarism inappropriate, although their answer was different, but they were knew that the plagiarism was a bad action and according their answer, plagiarism can make them lazy and make them as a bad character. It can be seen from all of their answer of question 2.

Question 3: most of the students' knew the example of plagiarism, although their answer was different, but they were knew the example of plagiarsm. It can be seen from all of their answer of question 3.

Question 4: all of the students' knew that the plagiarism is false, although their reason was different, but they were knew the plagiarsm is false. It can be seen from all of their answer of question 4.

Question 5: most of the students' knew the why the students do plagiarism, although their answer was different, but they were knew why the students do plagiarsm. It can be seen from all of their answer of question 5.

Question 6: all of the students' knew how to prevent the plagiarism, although their reason was different, but they were knew how to prevent the plagiarism. It can be seen from all of their answer of question 6.

In the digital era, acquisition and delivery of data can be simple and fast especially with the internet as a highly efficient vehicle. Therefore, new options are available for students who want to plagiarize. The development of internet also contributed for the creation of tools to detect plagiarism. However, such tools should not be playing the main role but rather a complementary aid to the educators.

This research surveyed students at University of Muhammadiyah Sumatera Utara to explore their perception about plagiarism. As stated in chapter 2, perception is how an individual "sees" others and how others perceivean individual. This is accomplished through various means such asclassifying an individual based on a single characteristic (halo effect). The halo effect occurs when an individual draws a general impression aboutanother person based on a single characteristic, such as intelligence, sociability, or appearance. The perceiver may evaluate the other individual high on many traits because of his or her belief

that the individual is highin one trait. The halo effect is applicable to individuals' perceptions of others and of organizations.

According to Blum (2009) one of the common reasons for someone to plagiarize cited in the results was the lack of interest in the topic of study therefore it is responsibility of the teachers to make sure to design the course in an attractive way. Moreover, the involvement should also come from the academia part; the recycling of assignments every time the course is given is a sign of teacher's lack of involvement in the education as well as a temptation for students to commit plagiarism by for example getting a copy of the solution from previous course students.

Based on the results above, it can be concluded that the students' perception about plagiarism is good perception, it can be seen from the students' answerof question 1 to question 6,they were knew the plagiarism was a bad action. Besides that, plagiarism make them lazy and make them as a bad character.

CHAPTER V

CONCLUSIONS AND SUGGESTIONS

A. Conclusions

Based on the research results on chapter IV, the research concluded that the students' perception about plagiarism is good perception, it can be seen from the students' answer of question 1 to question 6, they are knew that the plagiarism is a bad action. Besides that, plagiarism make them lazy and make them as a bad character.

B. Suggestions

Heaving seen the result of the study, the suggestion that researcher introduce as the following:

- 1. It is suggested that the students should know that the plagiarism is bad action, and then through this research improved their understanding about plagiarism.
- 2. The teacher should be give some explanation to the students that the plagiarism is not good action, because it can make them lazy in learning. Besides that, the teacher should used the various method in teaching and learning process to improve their good motivation.
- 3. This research also can be used as reference for other researcher who try to conducted the similar research dealing with discourse analysis.
