# TRANSPOSITION AND MODULATION IN THE TRANSLATION OF THE LAND OF FIVE TOWERS INTO NEGERI 5 MENARA

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#### **CHAPTER I**

#### INTRODUCTION

#### A. Background of The Study

Translation is one of important thing in teaching learning English process as foreign language in Indonesia. As a country that uses English as a foreign language, needs skills to understand clearly in communication of both source language (SL) and target language (TL). The use of translation is as a bridge for people to understand the message from the source language which is translated into the target language with the same meaning.

Hatim and Munday (2004:6) define translation as "the process of transferring a written text from source language (SL) to target language (TL)". In this definition, they emphasize translation as a process. They notes that "translation is a phenomenon that has a huge effect on everyday life." The first of these two senses relates to translation as a process, the second relates to the product. The first sense focuses on the role of the translator in taking the original or source text (ST) and turning it into a text in another language (the target text, TT). The second sense centers on the concrete translation the product produced by the translator.

The translators aim is to avoid misunderstanding and misinterpretation on the part of target language (TL). Suryawinata & Haryanto (2003: 67) state that "translation strategy is a technical guide to translate words for words, phrases for phrases, or sentences for sentences". In translation literatures, the translation strategy is also called translation procedure. Based on practical characteristics, translation procedures directly relates to practical problem and problem solving in translation.

In this case, the researcher use two translation procedures. The translation procedures are transposition and modulation. The researcher choose transposition and modulation in the translation to carried out and obtain the equivalence. It's mean that the equivalence from the meaning and not form. This is in accordance with the opinion of Nida and Taber, the translation must be reproducing the message not the similarity between the phrase. Then, the researcher define transposition as a translation strategy which involves the changing of grammatical forms from SL to TL. The aim of using transposition is to obtain appropriate grammatical forms and common lexicons in TL.

In Indonesia, there are many literary products written in English which are translated into Indonesian, such as book, novels, poems, and movies. As one type of literature, novel is a fictitious prose narrative of considerable length and complexity, portraying characters and usually presenting a sequential organization of action and scenes. Therefore, in translating novel there are dual demands, transfer the content is must be good as well as the form transfer.

The researcher choose *The Land of Five Towers* novel as the object of research because there were so many transposition and modulation found in the novel and the story of the novel have a moral message which can be applied in the real life. Even though, there were some problems in this research, students in University of Muhammadiyah North Sumatera especially VII-E Morning feel

difficulties to find transposition and modulation in the novel and they feel so bored when translating sentences. And then, they do not understand the meaning of the words or sentences or paragraph in the novel. The fact, translating novel needs hard work because of translating the word and stringing sentences that want to be displayed. The use of translation is as a bridge for people to understand the message from the source language which is translated into the target language with the same meaning. So, transposition and modulation in the translation from source language to the target language is important.

Based on the explanation above, the researcher interested in analyzing of transposition and modulation, the research then named "Transposition and Modulation in the Translation of The Land of Five Towers into Negeri 5 Menara".

#### B. The Identification of The Problem

The problems of this research will formulated as follows:

- Many students at University of Muhammadiyah North Sumatera on English Department especially VII-E Morning still confused and not yet fully understand about transposition and modulation that used in the novel.
   So, they still misinterpret the novel.
- 2. Many students did not know the types of transposition and modulation used in the novel *The Land of Five Towers*. So, they still misunderstanding about it.

# C. Scope and Limitation

From the background that has been explained by the researcher, the scope is translation. And the limitation of this research is focuses on the transposition and modulation that found in the novel *The Land of Five Towers into*.

# **D.** The Formulations of The Study

The problems of this study will formulated as follows:

- 1. What types of transposition and modulation are used in the novel *The Land of Five Towers*?
- 2. What types of transposition and modulation are dominantly used in the novel *The Land of Five Towers*?

# E. The Objectives of The Study

In line with the problems, the objectives will be:

- 1. To find out the types of transposition and modulation that used in novel *The Land of Five Towers*.
- 2. To find out the dominant types of transposition and modulation that used in novel *The Land of Five Tower*.

# F. The Significance of The Study

The findings of the research are expected to be useful theoretically and practically

- 1. Theoretically, finding of this research will give deeper information and wide understanding about transposition and modulation and it can be used as a reference in learning transposition and modulation in the novel.
- 2. Practically, it was expected that this study will be useful for the students to know the types of transposition and modulation. And this research will be useful for the readers to understand English novel better.

#### **CHAPTER II**

# REVIEW OF LITERATURE

#### A. Theoretical Framework

In conducting a research, theories are needed to explain some concept or terms applied in the research concerned. Some terms will be used in the study and they need to be theoretically explained. In the following part, theoretical by the terms are presented.

#### **1** Description of Translation

#### 1.1 Definition of Translation

Many linguists have defined translation in their own way. (Newmark, 1988: 5) says that translation can be explained as a skill consisting in the effort to replace a meaning from source language into target language by the same meaning of both languages. Newmark notes that the translation is rendering the meaning of a text into another language in the way the author intended.

According to Nida and Taber, translation can be define as the translating process consists of reproducing in target language the closest same meaning of the source language, and they are added that the translation has two terms, first in term of meaning and secondly in terms of style. They also state that the translation should be the closest natural equivalent of source language, both in the meaning and the style of receptor language.

Hatim and Munday (2004:6) define translation as "the process of transferring a written text from source language (SL) to target language (TL)". In this definition, they emphasize translation as a process. They notes that "translation is a phenomenon that has a huge effect on everyday life." The first of these two senses relates to translation as a process, the second to the product. The first sense focuses on the role of the translator in taking the original or source text (ST) and turning it into a text in another language (the target text, TT). The second sense centers on the concrete translation the product produced by the translator. Machali (2000, p. 60) noted that "translation as an operation performed on languages: a process of substituting a text in one language for a text in another".

#### 1.2 Translation Process

The process of translation between two different written languages involves the changing of an original written text (the source text or ST) in the original verbal language (the source language or (SL) into a written text (the target text or TT) in a different verbal language (the target language or TL).

In source language (SL) In target language (TL)

Translation may be denned as follows: the replacement of textual material in one language (SL) by equivalent textual material in another language (TL). Translation as a process is always uni-directional: it is always performed in a given direction. 'from' a Source Language 'into' a Target Language.

There are four significant elements that must be presented in the translation: the meaning realization, sources language, the target language and the translator itself. The last factor may be the most important factor because it is the subject of all translation activities.

The translation process usually envelops two major activities: coding the SL text and doing the recording the text TL. In the first activity translator ability in grammar, semantics, syntax, idioms from the SL text along with understanding source text culture. The same capability is also required in the TL. These capabilities that make the translation are usually done to the language translators as a native speaker.

#### 1.3 Translation Procedures

Procedures are the strategies (conscious or unconscious, verbal or nonverbal) used by the translator to solve problems that emerge when carrying out the translation process with a particular objective in mind. According to Macquarie Dictionary in Machali (2000:62) procedure in translation is "the act or manner of proceeding in any action or process". Suryawinata & Haryanto (2003: 67) state that "translation strategy is a technical guide to translate words for words, phrases for phrases, or sentences for sentences". Based on practical characteristics, translation strategy directly relates to practical problem and problem solving in translation.

Procedures are an important part of procedural knowledge, they are related to knowing how to do something, the ability to organize actions to reach a specific goal. Procedures include the use of simple techniques and skills, as well as expert use of strategies. Therefore Vinay and Darbelnet in Lili (2009:1) proposes seven procedures in translation in which those seven procedures compile into two general categories i.e. direct and oblique. It depends on the timing to decide whether direct or oblique that will be used in translating a text.

The translator will use direct procedure when structural and conceptual elements of the SL can be translated immediately into target language, while oblique is used when structural and conceptual elements of SL cannot directly translated without changing the meaning and stylistic elements to TL. Direct translation consists of three procedures (borrowing, calque and literal translation), they are used when structural and conceptual elements of the source language can be transposed into the target language, while oblique translation consists of four procedures (transposition, modulation, equivalence and adaptation).

#### 1.3.1 Borrowing

Borrowing is used when the SL word is transferred directly to the TL. This usually happens because (a) the SL term does not have any equivalent in TL and/or (b) the SL term has been recognized in TL vocabulary.

#### **1.3.2** Calque

It is a procedure to 'borrow' the SL expression or structure and then transfer it in a literal translation. In other words calque is a special kind of borrowing, so. as borrowing procedure mentioned above, it has the same influence on the enhancement of cultural integration.

#### 1.3.3 Literal Translation

Literal translation is briefly a procedure of word-for-word translation in translating the SL to TL. It is used the most common in translating between languages of the same family and culture. Vinay and Darbelnet (1958) states that literal translation is the direct transfer of SL text into a grammatically and idiomatically appropriate TL text in which the translator task is limited to observing the adherence to the linguistic servitudes of the TL.

# 1.3.4 Equivalence

Equivalence is a procedure to describe the same situation by using completely different stylistic or structural methods for producing equivalent texts. In other words, the procedure of equivalence can be used to translate fixed expression in SL such as idioms, clichés, proverbs, nominal or adjectival phrases, animal onomatopoeia, etc. into the equal different form in TL.

#### 1.3.5 Adaptation

Lili (2009) in her journal states that this procedure refers to a method used in the cases where the type of situation being referred to by the SL message is unknown in the TL culture. In such cases translators have to create a new situation in SL that can be considered as being equivalent in TL. Adaptation can, therefore, be described as a special kind of equivalence, a situational equivalence. Titles of books, movies, and characters fit into this category.

# 1.3.6 Transposition

Rather than transposition, Catford uses the word "shift" for this procedure while Vinay and Dalbernet stick with "transposition", however what they describe

about this procedure are the same. Transposition is obviously a kind of translation procedure which involves the grammatical changing from SL to TL without changing the meaning of the message.

# 1.3.7 Modulation

Modulation is a change in the target language related to the shift of meaning that occurs because there is a change in looking manner, and mindset change. The term modulation is also stated by Vinay and Darbelnet (158: 51) with the definition "a variation through a change of viewpoint, of perspective and very often of category of thought".

# 2. Description of Transposition

# 2.1 Definition of Transposition

The term transposition is firstly proposed by Catford (1965: 73) with the name "shift" and by Vinay and Darbelnet (1958: 97) with the name "transposition". In *Dictionary of Translation Studies*, Shuttleworth & Cowie (1997: 190) quoted the definition of Vinay and Darbelnet as follows: "Transposition is defined as the process of replacing one word class with another without changing the meaning of the message".

Then Newmark (1988: 85-89) states that not only the world class which is changed, but also the grammatical structure. Newmark defines transposition as "a translation procedure involving a change in the grammar from SL to TL". The term is then developed by Machali (2000) to analyze translation strategy from English into Indonesian.

Transposition is the first technique or step towards oblique translation. Oblique translation is another term for free translation where the translator exercises freedom to attain equivalence. It operates at the grammatical level and it consists of the replacement of a word class by another word class without changing the meaning. From a stylistic view point, the transposed expression does not have the same value, but the meaning is the same. Transposed expressions are usually more literary in character. What is the most important is to choose the form that best fits the context.

Transposition can be:

- a) Free: when the transposition that we use is mainly dependent on the context and particularly on the desired effect. For example:
  - The course is of interest to all of us. (The course interest all of us: back translation).
- b) Compulsory: when only a transposition is acceptable, thus it is absolutely necessary in a particular context. For instance:
  - I will never forget that time when I saw you in the village. (I will never forget the time that I saw you in the village: back translation).

#### 2.2 Transposition Types

Machali (2000: 63-64) classifies transposition into four types: (1) rules of singular noun and plural noun, (2) patterns of noun phrase structure, (3) common equivalences of TL and (4) grammatical-structure changes of linguistic.

#### 2.2.1 The First Form Transposition

The first form transposition is a rules of singular noun and plural noun. A translator translates English to Indonesian will search equivalent transposition as follow.

#### Example:

English	Indonesia
A pair of scissors	Sebuah gunting

The other example, the transposition above is a translation procedure that must be done in translation. It is engaging English as source language and Indonesian language as the target. Therefore, the translator will not make a mistake, for example, flower gardens = bunga kebun (should kebun bunga). This case indicates that if the nominal phrase in the English language consists of a line of adjective and the number, then the translation starts of the adjective closest the noun.

#### 2.2.2 The Second Form Transposition

The second form transposition is patterns of noun phrase structure. This is literal grammatically which possible but may not accord with natural usage in the TL. Transposition is caused by the level of fairness is lacking in the translation result with the literal translation method through grammatical structure.

#### Example:

English	Indonesia

# 2.2.3 The Third Form Transposition

A third type of transposition is required when an SL grammatical structure does not exist in the TL. Here there are always options. Thus for the neutral adjective as subject, there is a choice of at least. The gerund can be translated by verb-noun or a subordinate clause with a recast main clause or in some language, a noun-infinitive.

This form of transposition is the selection existence in the target language:

a) The act of placing adjective in the foreground and followed by the subject there is not the concept of English grammatical structure.

Example:

English Indonesia

I'm surprised Terkejut aku

b) The act of placing objects in the foreground in Indonesia does not appear in English grammatical structure.

Example:

Indonesia : Kertas itu boleh kamu potong

English : You may cut the paper

c) The act of placing the verbs in the foreground in Indonesia not common in English grammatical structure, except for imperative sentences.

Example:

Indonesian : Telah dianalisa penggunannya

English : Its usage has been analyzed

# 2.2.4 The Fourth Form Transposition

The fourth type of Transposition is modified-modifier pattern in English is translated into modified-modifier pattern in Indonesia to modify noun-phrase structure.

In the above data, noun phrases "world-class hotels", "shopping malls" and "their own boutique shopping arcades" that have Modified-Modifier pattern are translated into "hotel kelas dunia", "pusat perbelanjaan" dan "arcade

belanja butiknya sendiri" that have Modifier-Modified pattern. Related to grammatical structure, of noun –phrase modification.

# **3** Description of Modulation

#### 3.1 Definition of Modulation

Modulation is a change in the target language related to the shift of meaning that occurs because there is a change in looking manner, and mindset change. The term modulation is "a variation through a change of viewpoint, of perspective and very often of category of thought".

According to Vinay and Darbenet into two types: recorded modulation is called standard modulation and free modulation. Standard modulation such as 'water-tower', are recorded in bilingual dictionaries. Free modulation are used by translator 'when the TL rejects literal translation', which by vinay and dalbenet criteria, means virtually always.

#### Example:

SL: You should know that module writing takes time

TL: Perlu diketahui bahwa menulis modul itu memakan banyak waktu

In *Dictionary of Translation Studies*, Shuttleworth and Cowie quote the opinion of van Leuven-Swart that divides modulation into two kinds: generalization and specification. They define generalization as "the type of modulation in which the dissimilarity between ST and TT is characterized by a shift towards greater generality in TT; as such it contrasts with the opposite phenomenon of specification".

Concerning with specification, Shuttleworth & Cowie (1997: 159) explain that Specification is distinguished from the other type, generalization, in that here the shift which occurs between ST and TT transemes is in the direction of a higher level of explicitness. In other words, a shift towards greater specification will produce a transemes the meaning of which is made more precise, by either the addition of extra words or the use of words with a less general meaning.

In the above definition of generalization and specification, there is a term transeme. Van Leuven-Zwart (1989: 164) explains that transeme refers to a basic unit for the linguistic comparison of a literary text and its integral translation. Reasoning that "sentences are generally too long and words too short to be easily compared", I suggest the transeme as a suitable basic unit of comparison.

Modulation is then developed by Machali (2000: 67-69) to analyze translation strategy from English into Indonesian or vv. Modulation as a translation strategy which involves meaning shifts due to perspective change or point of view. The aim of using modulation is to obtain meaning equivalence between the meaning of SL and TL.

# 3.2 Modulation Types

Furthermore, Machali (2000: 69) classifies modulation into three types: (1) addition/creation of linguistic units, (2) specific-general meaning and (3) clarified meaning and natural equivalence.

# 3.2.1. Addition Units

Modulation is done if a word, phrase or other linguistic units have no equivalence in TL, so it should be added/created.

In the above data, there is no equivalence of noun phrase 'city-state' in TL, so it is created a phrase 'negara berukuran kota'.

# 3.2.2 Specific-General Meaning

Modulation is done for a word translation in which only a part of its meaning aspects in SL can be expressed in TL, i.e. from specific meaning to general meaning.

In the above data, word 'visitors' that lexically means 'pengunjung' in TL is translated into 'wisatawan' in order to obtain general meaning. Moreover, the word 'wisatawan' is broadly known and accepted as an appropriate term in tourism industry.

# 3.2.3 Clarified Meaning

Modulation is done that aims to clarify meaning and find natural equivalence in TL.

In the above data, noun phrase 'boarding house' that literally means 'rumah indekos' is translated into 'pondok wisata' in order to clarify meaning, more natural in TL and has been broadly used in tourism terminology.

# 4. Biography of The Author



Ahmad Fuadi (born 30 December 1972) is an Indonesian writer, novelist and social entrepreneur. His debut novel Negeri 5 Menara (The Land of 5 Towers) broke the publisher's sales record (Gramedia Pustaka Utama) for the last 37 years. Negeri 5 Menara is the first part of the Negeri 5 Menara trilogy, followed by Ranah 3 Warna (The Earth of 3 Colors), and Rantau 1 Muara was brought into wide-screen version and listed as one of the most watched Indonesian movies in the year of 2012.

He's also well known for his extraordinary achievement in achieving 9 overseas scholarships. #### **B.** The Previous Related Studies

There are some studies that related to this research which had been conducted before. They were :

1. The first study is conducted Budi Purnomo in Arab World English Journal (AWEJ), Department of Tourism, Sahid Tourism Institute of Surakarta. Solo City,

Central Java, Indonesia. Vol. 6. No. 3 September 2015 on his journal entitled Transposition and Modulation to Translate Tourism Texts From English into Indonesian. This study focused on attempt to evaluate the types and accuracy of two translation strategies, i.e. transposition and modulation. The data sources are obtained from document and inter-raters. In this journal, they reveal the types of transposition and modulation, the English and Indonesian texts were analyzed. They also reveal to know the accuracy of transposition and modulation, the translations were rated by three expert raters.

2. The thesis by Muhammad Ridwan Roji Abdullah (2014) on his thesis entitled: Transposition and Modulation Analysis on the Translation of *Prayer for Rain* into *Do'a Minta Hujan*. This study focused on overcome the problems, need to go through the procedure that consist of three steps. The objectives of the study is to know what are the translation procedures used by the translator in the poem *Prayer for Rain* creation David Campbell by Taufik Ismail and to know how the message was conveyed from SL to TL. This thesis is qualitative method and using bibliography. In this thesis, there are some translations procedures in this translations, such as transposition and modulation and used in literal translation, the expressed of the meaning side.

From the previous related studies above, we obtained the difference which is presented by this study. The difference between this study and previous research is from the object of the study and different types of transposition and modulation. In the previous related studies, focused on attempt to evaluate the types and accuracy of two translation strategies. And in this study, the researcher

focused on types and dominant types of transposition and modulation. Then, in the previous study, the literary product is poem. This study used novel as literary product.

# C. Conceptual Framework

Transposition and modulation are two translation procedure which involves the changing of grammatical forms from SL to TL. The aim of using transposition is to obtain appropriate grammatical forms and common lexicons in TL. Transposition and modulation can help the students more understanding about the translation especially using a novel. The variable of this research refers to analyzing transposition and modulation in *The Land of Five Towers* Novel. The problems of this research are to find the types of transposition and modulation. This is very interesting to find transposition and modulation in the novel.

#### **CHAPTER III**

#### METHOD OF RESEARCH

#### A. Research Design

This research was conducted by using descriptive qualitative method. According to J.Moleong (2016; 11) descriptive qualitative research is research which contains excerpts of data to illustrate the presentation of the report, could be interviews, photographs, videotapes, notes or memo and other documents and researchers analyzed in its original form.

This design is used to analysis them to find out the transposition and modulation in the translation *The Land of Five Towers* novel.

#### B. Source of Data

The source of the data was taken from *The Land of Five Towers* novel. The author is Ahmad Fuadi and translated by Angie Kilbane. The novel was published on 2011 under the title *Negeri 5 Menara*. The novel consists of 383 pages. The data was taken from 10 chapter based a systematic sampling choosen, including chapter 1, chapter 5, chapter 10, chapter 15, chapter 20, chapter 25, chapter 30, chapter 35, chapter 40, and the last chapter 45.

# C. Technique of Collecting Data

In collecting the data, the researcher will apply the procedures as follow:

- 1. Reading the novel *The Land of Five Towers* carefully and intensively.
- 2. Identifying transposition and modulation that found in the novel.
- 3. Listing the types of transposition and modulation that found in the novel.

#### D. Technique of Data Analysis

In analyzing the data, the researcher is using theory proposed by Miles and Huberman (1994) said that the qualitative data analysis consist of three procedures. The procedures of data will be analyzed based on the following steps:

#### 1. Data Reduction

Data reduction means the process of sorting, focusing, identifying, simplifying, abstracting, and transforming of the data that are considered important. In the conducting research, the researcher was selected data that was given valuable information in research; the data is chosen by identifying and classifying the types of transposition and modulation.

# 2. Data Display

Data display means the process to simplify the data in the form of sentences, narrative, or table. In displaying data, the researcher describes data by tabulating of the types of transposition and modulation in table.

# 3. Drawing and Verifying Conclusion

The last step after doing the data display is drawn of the conclusion and verification. It is used to describe all of the data, so that it was came clearly. The conclusion can be able to answer the formulation of the problem that formulated from the beginning.

#### **CHAPTER IV**

### DATA AND DATA ANALYSIS

#### A. The Data

As explained in the previous chapter, the data of this study were taken from *The Land of Five Towers* novel. The author is Ahmad Fuadi and translated by Angie Kilbane. The novel was published on 2011 under the title *Negeri 5 Menara*. The novel consists of 383 pages. The data was taken from 10 chapter. The data was identified the types of transposition and modulation in the novel, the data can be presented as shown in the data analysis.

# B. Data Analysis

# 1. The Types of Transposition Found in *The Land of Five Towers* Novel

After collecting the data, the writer firstly classified them based on the types of transposition. There are four types of transposition. There are: the first form, the second form, the third form and the fourth form of transposition.

Furthermore, the results of the analysis were obtained and shown in the table 4.1 as following:

Based on the table 4.1, there were 83 sentences as the data that found in the transposition type. There were 27 sentences found in the type 1. 28 sentences found in the type 2. 23 sentences found in the type 3 and 5 sentences in the type 4.

1. The first form transposition, there were 27 sentences found in the type 1 because a rules of singular noun and plural noun.

- No. 2: The sentences (I heard a soft tap) is singular, translate into (Aku mendengar ketukan-ketukan halus) is plural. It can be translate into ketukan.
- No. 5: The sentences (Commuter cars) is plural, translate into (Mobil karyawan) is singular. It can be translate into mobil-mobil para karyawan.
- No. 17: The sentences (My fingers danced skillfully over the keyboard) is
  plural, translate into (Jariku menari diatas keyboard) is singular. It can be
  translate into jari-jariku.
- No. 19: The sentences (Our wooden door) is singular, translate into (Pintu-pintu kayu kami) is plural. It can be translate into pintu kayu kami.

- No. 39: The sentences (Shadows of cows, water buffaloes, horses and goats) is plural, translate into (Bayangan sapi, kerbau, kuda dan kambing) is singular. It can be translate into bayangan-bayangan sapi, kerbau-kerbau, kuda dan kambing-kambing.
- 2. The second form transposition, there were 28 sentences found in the type 2 because patterns of noun phrase structure. This is literal grammatically.

- No. 1: The sentences (I went up to the glass window and touched its surface) translate into (Aku mendekat kejendela kaca dan menyentuh permukaannya dengan ujung telunjuk kananku). The TL and SL is translate literally grammatically.
- No. 6: The sentences (Hate it because of having to bundle myself in thick) translate into (Benci karena harus membebat diri degan baju tebal). The TL and SL is translate literally grammatically.
- No.12: The sentences (Today, I was more enthusiastic than usual)
  translate into (Hari ini, aku lebih bersemangat dari biasa). The TL and
  SL is translate literally grammatically.
- No.24: The sentences (If there were a sarong wearing competition, I was sure I'd be the world champion) translate into (Seandainya ada lomba memakain sarung, aku yakin aku pasti menjadi juaranya). The TL and SL is translate literally grammatically.
- No.43: The sentences (For us, the gloriousness of Friday was more than because it was) translate into (Bagi kami, kemuliaan hari jumat

**lebih dari hari kesukaan).** The TL and SL is translate literally grammatically.

3. The third form transposition, there were 23 sentences found in the type 3 because required when an SL grammatical structure does not exist in the TL and the act of placing object in the foreground in Indonesia does not appear in English grammatical structure.

- No. 3: The sentences (Usually lush but now bare-branched American elms spread before the building) translate into (Didepan gedung ini, hamparan pohon American elms yang biasanya rimbun kini tinggal dahan). The act of placing object in the foreground in Indonesia does not appear in English grammatical structure.
- No. 15: The sentences (I reopened the titanium screen) translate into
   (Layar berbahan titanium kembali aku kuakkan). The act of placing
   object in the foreground in Indonesia does not appear in English
   grammatical structure.
- No. 33: The sentences (It only took me five minutes to get everything together) translate into (Memakai semua ini cukup lima menit saja). The act of placing object in the foreground in Indonesia does not appear in English grammatical structure.
- No. 52: The sentences (Not to mention that they were hesitant to ask permission) translate into (Apalagi mereka malas minta izin dari

**tukang piket).** The act of placing object in the foreground in Indonesia does not appear in English grammatical structure.

4. The fourth form transposition, there were 5 sentences found in the type 4 because modified-modifier pattern in English is translated into modified-modifier pattern in Indonesia to modify noun-phrase structure.

### Example:

- No. 4: The sentences (Bare-branched American elms) translate into
   (Pohon American elms). In the above data, noun phrase Bare-branched American elms that have modified-modifier pattern.
- No.10: The sentences (The centre of the various Smithsonian museum all of which) translate into (Tempat berpusatnya aneka museum Smithsonian). In the above data, noun phrase Bare-branched American elms that have modified-modifier pattern.

Considering to the table 4.3, it can be concluded that the types of transposition which was dominantly occurred in The Land of Five Towers Novel was The Second Form Transposition (Type 2). It occurs 28 times out of the total 83 data. In other words, from the total 100%, the percentage is 33.74%. Then, the second most often appearing, there was The First Form Transposition (Type 1). It occurs 27 times or 32.53%. After that, the third rank is The Third Form Transposition (Type 3). It occurs 23 times with the percentage of 27.71%. And finally, the last rank types of transposition is The Fourth Form Transposition (Type 4). It occurs 5 times or 6.02%. This result shows that the most dominant types of transposition found The Second Form Transposition (Type 2) was 28 times with the amount of (33.74%).

### 3. The Types of Modulation Found in *The Land of Five Towers* Novel

After collecting the data, the writer firstly classified them based on the types of modulation. There are three types of modulation, there are additional units, specific-general meaning, and clarified meaning.

Furthermore, the results of the analysis were obtained and shown in the table 4.4 as following:

Based on the table 4.4, there were 34 sentences as the data that found in the modulation type. There were 10 sentences found in additional unit. 15 sentences found in the specific-general meaning. 9 sentences found in the clarified meaning.

- Additional Unit, there were 10 sentences found in this type if a word, phrase or other linguistic units have no equivalence in TL, so it should be added/created.
   Example :
  - No. 1: The sentences (On a whim, I went up to the glass window) translate into (Iseng saja, aku mendekat ke jendela kaca). The word have no equivalence in TL, so it should be add.
  - No.5: The sentences (I stuck my camera) translate into (Kamera). The
    word have no equivalence in TL, so it should be add.
  - No. 11: The sentences (He wanted to borrow one) translate into (mau meminjam). The word have no equivalence in TL, so it should be add.
- 2. Specific-General Meaning, there were 15 sentences found in this type because a word translation in which only a part of its meaning aspects in SL can be expressed in TL, i.e. from specific meaning to general meaning.

### Example:

No. 3: The sentences (Reporter) translate into (Peliput). Word 'reporter'
that lexically means 'wartawan' in TL is translated into 'peliput' in order
to obtain general meaning.

- No. 4: The sentences (Panelist) translate into (Panelis). Word 'panelist' that lexically means 'peserta' in TL is translated into 'panelis' in order to obtain general meaning.
- No. 10: The sentences (Card) translate into (Karcis). Word 'card' that
  lexically means 'kartu' in TL is translated into 'karcis' in order to obtain
  general meaning.
- No. 16: The sentences (Supervisors) translate into (Pengurus). Word
   'supervisors' that lexically means 'pengawas' in TL is translated into
   'pengurus' in order to obtain general meaning.
- 3. Clarified Meaning, there were 9 sentences found in this type because the aims to clarify meaning and find natural equivalence in TL.

- No. 19: The sentences (In the first category were lucky one) translate into (Golongan pertama adalah golongan yang beruntung). Word 'In the first category were lucky one' that lexically means 'kategori pertama yang beruntung' in TL is translated into 'Golongan pertama adalah golongan yang beruntung' in order to clarify meaning.
- No. 27: The sentences (I found this market very interesting.) translate into (Pemandangan pasar ini sungguh menarik hatiku). Word 'I found this market very interesting' that lexically means 'aku menemukan pasar yang sangat menarik' in TL is translated into 'Pemandangan pasar ini sungguh menarik hatiku' in order to clarify meaning.

Considering to the table 4.6, it can be concluded that the types of modulation which was dominantly occurred in The Land of Five Towers Novel was Specific-General meaning. It occurs 15 times out of the total 34 data. In other words, from the total 100%, the percentage is 44.12%. Then, the second most often appearing, there is Additional Unit. It occurs 10 times or 29.41%. After that, the last rank of the types of modulation is Clarified Meaning. It occurs 9 times with the percentage of 26.47%. This result shows that the most dominant types of modulation found Specific-General meaning. It occurs 15 times with the amount of (44.12%).

## C. Research Findings

Based on the analysis, it was found that four types of transposition, they are the first form, the second form, the third form and the fourth form of transposition. And three types of modulation, they are additional units, specific-general meaning, and clarified meaning in The Land of Five Towers Novel. The most dominant types of transposition found the second form transposition (Type 2) was 28 times with the amount of (33.74%). And this result shows that the most dominant types of modulation found specific-general meaning, it was 15 times with the amount of (44.12%).

#### **CHAPTER V**

### **CONCLUSION AND SUGGETION**

#### A. Conclusions

After analyzing the data of types of transposition and modulation in The Land of Five Towers. Conclusion are draws as follows:

1. There were four types of Transposition occurring in The Land of Five Towers novel with 83 data. The Second Form Transposition (Type 2). It occurs 28 times out of the total 83 data. In other words, from the total 100%, the percentage is 33.74%. Then, the second most often appearing, there was The First Form Transposition (Type 1). It occurs 27 times or 32.53%. After that, the third rank is The Third Form Transposition (Type 3). It occurs 23 times with the percentage of 27.71%. And finally, the last rank types of transposition is The Fourth Form Transposition (Type 4). It occurs 5 times or 6.02%. And there were three types of Modulation occurring in the land of five towers novel with 34 data. Specific-General meaning. It occurs 15 times out of the total 34 data. In other words, from the total 100%, the percentage is 44.12%. Then, the second most often appearing, there is Additional Unit. It occurs 10 times or 29.41%. After that, the last rank of the types of modulation is Clarified Meaning. It occurs 9 times with the percentage of 26.47%.

2. This result shows that the most dominant types of transposition found The Second Form Transposition (Type 2) was 28 times with the amount of (33.74%). This result shows that the most dominant types of modulation found Specific-General meaning. It occurs 15 times with the amount of (44.12%).

### **B.** Suggestions

In relation to the conclusion, suggestions were staged as the following:

#### 1. For the readers

It is suggested for the readers to understand that analysis on translation is not only about translate word by word. Thus, they have to study translation skill more deeply. It is expected that this research can be used as reference for reader to add their knowledge dealing with translation aspect.

#### 2. For the other researcher

It is suggested that order researcher conduct research related to those problems and give more explanation about the problems being analyzed.
